

Congratulations, you are now covered by a dental plan arranged by your employer.

What does the dental insurance cover?

The insurance covers all the most common dental treatments except treatments listed under insurance reservations.

- One yearly examination and cleaning
- Fillings (max. 3 fillings)
- · Root canal treatments
- Periodontal treatments (max. kr. 2000)
- Crowns, bridges and implants (prosthetic work, max kr. 5800) *
- · Dental surgery and extractions
- Night guards
- Periodontitis (max. kr. 2000)
- X-rays and anaesthesia

What does your dental insurance not cover?

- Cosmetic treatments
- Orthodontics
- Toothless areas and milk teeth

The annual maximum cover is DKK 20.000. You receive 80% cover for treatments in accordance to our pricelist. You can find an updated pricelist on our website under "practical info"

How to use your dental insurance

Once you have been at the dentist, you must pay the entire amount of the invoice yourself. Afterwards you upload the invoice via your profile on Dansk Tandforsikrings website. Should your dentist use the system called "DentalSuite", the invoice can be submitted automatically, and you do not need to forward your dental bill. All refunds will be deposited directly into your NemKonto.

If you are member of Sygeforsikringen "danmark"

If you have a dental insurance and at the same time a membership at Sygeforsikringen "danmark" you might receive refunds from both companies.

^{*} Prosthetic treatments have certain restrictions. Teeth that have undergone a root canal treatment without placement of a crown and teeth with 3 og more fillings/cracks are covered for everything except prosthetics. Prosthetic treatments which have been previously diagnosed, recommended, planned or were in progress prior to the time of the insurance are not covered at all. You will find more information about this in your terms and conditions.
